DAFFODILS and/or NARCISSI	
1	Long trumpet, outer petals yellow, trumpet yellow - 3 blooms, 1 variety
2	Long trumpet, any colour combination except outer petals yellow, trumpet yellow - 3 blooms, 1 variety
3	Long trumpet, any colour combination except outer petals yellow, trumpet yellow - 1 bloom
4	Medium trumpet, outer petals yellow, trumpet yellow - 3 blooms, 1 variety
5	Medium trumpet, any colour combination except outer petals yellow, trumpet yellow - 3 blooms, 1 variety
6	Short trumpet, outer petals yellow, any trumpet colour - 1 bloom
7	Short trumpet, outer petals white or cream, any trumpet colour - 1 bloom
8	Double blooms, outer petals yellow, centre any other colour - 1 blooms, 1 variety
9	Daffodils and/or Narcissi, 6 different varieties - 1 stem or bloom of each variety
10	Miniature daffodils single - 3 stems, 1 variety
11	Miniature daffodils multi-flowers - 3 stems, 1 variety
12	Narcissi Poetaz (multi-flowers) - 3 stems, 1 variety
12a	1 vase 3 stems any daffodils not in the above classes

- 1. Long trumpet:** when trumpet is as long, or longer than the petals
- 2. Medium trumpet:** when trumpet is longer than 1/3 of the length, but less than equal to the length, of the outer petals
- 3. Short trumpet:** when trumpet is less than 1/3 the length of the outer petals

13	Tulips, any variety of Darwin cupped type bloom - 3 blooms
14	Tulips, any variety of other shaped blooms - 3 blooms
15	Hyacinth - 1 spike
16	Grape Hyacinths - 3 blooms
17	Anemones - 3 blooms
18	Wallflowers - 3 stems
19	Polyanthus, mixed - 3 stems
20	Primroses, cultivated, yellow with leaves - 6 blooms
21	Primroses, cultivated, mixed with leaves - 6 blooms
22a	Pansies - 6 blooms exhibited flat on boards supplied at the show
22b	Hellebores - 6 blooms exhibited flat on boards supplied at the show
23	Any other spring flower - 3 blooms, 1 variety (ie.1 bloom per stem)
24	Any other spring flower - 3 stems, 1 variety (ie. more than 1 bloom per stem)
25	Pot plant, flowering, other than bulbous
26	Pot plant, flowering, bulbous
27	House plant, named (any variety), maximum pot diameter 10"
28	One cactus, maximum pot diameter 6½"
29	One succulent, maximum pot diameter 6½"
30	Collection of Cacti, 4 pots, pot diameter less than 6½", displayed on a tray
31a	Collection of shrubs in flower, from your garden, for the Doris Hammond trophy
31b	Vase of spring flowers, from your garden – 6 different varieties, any combination of herbaceous, bulb or shrub

FLORAL ART	
32	Elongated foliage arrangement - not more than 24" overall
33	Spring arrangement in a basket for beginners - not more than 12" overall
34	Arrangement of three fresh flowers and any natural material in a recycled container, not more than 12" overall
35	Miniature Spring flower arrangement - not more than 9" overall
36	Arrangement of fruit, grasses and flowers

37	Photograph - Patterns formed in or by nature
38	Photograph - Capturing Spring

ART, CRAFT AND BAKING SECTION	
39a	Painting or drawing, landscape - Reflections in water
39b	Painting or drawing, still life - Items from the greenhouse or potting shed
39c	Painting or drawing, portrait - Of any a person from a photograph (photograph to be displayed with exhibit)
39d	Painting or Drawing, any subject other than those above, in any medium
40	Any item, Hand Knitted
41	Any item of Crochet

50	UNDER 5 YEARS	Decorate a hard boiled egg
51	UNDER 7 YEARS	A collage entitled Springtime using any craft material, maximum size A4
52	7-9 YEARS	A greeting card for any special occasion
53	7-9 YEARS	Make and decorate a pair of binoculars using two cardboard tubes
54	10-14 YEARS	Design or generate an exhibit of any recyclable materials
55	Any age group	Decorate a jar for spring flowers

GENERAL RULES

1. Entry restricted to amateurs
2. Only one entry per class is permitted per person
3. All exhibits, except classes 32 - 36 to have been grown or made by exhibitor
4. Pot plants to have been in the possession of exhibitor for 6 months
5. The Committee shall appoint judges whose decisions are final. Judges will be guided by the RHS Horticultural Show Handbook, but may use their discretion
6. The Committee shall take all ordinary care of exhibits, but cannot be held responsible for any loss or damage incurred
7. Trophies will be presented at the show, taken for engraving and then be held by the committee. Winners will receive a wooden plaque, in recognition of their success in the show
